After watching the film, complete **ONE** of the following choices and write a personal response to the film. You may respond in **ANY** way that you which. Here are some of the types of responses:

- 1. Write a poem, at least 8 lines long, with an explanation (one paragraph minimum) of the word, choice, literal meaning and the theme or overall message of your poem.
- 2. Write a ONE PAGE response explaining what you liked about the film and what you disliked. Ensure that you make reference to how it made reference to and/or depicted the Armenian Genocide. Do you think the film was effective? Why or why not.
- 3. Read a film review of Ararat. Do you agree or disagree with the reviewer's commentary? Explain (minimum one page).
- 4. Ask a series of questions about the film and follow each question with your own answer to it. The questions should relate to what you already know about the Armenian Genocide.
- 5. Analyse a character in the film by:
- a) Naming the character
- b) explaining the character's role in the film
- c) describing the character's actions in the film
- d) explaining the character's motivations for his/her actions
- 6. Explain your thoughts about why the Customs Official, played by Christopher Plummer, did not arrest Raffi for smuggling drugs.
