CHY 4UI: Essay Assignment

Task: To produce a *reliably-researched* and *well-cited* argumentative/*persuasive essay* that *defends a position/opinion* about an important historical figure **OR** a political or social/cultural movement **OR** an important historical event that occurred in World History between the years **1500** and the present.

## Requirements:

Length: 7-9 pages of written text (does not. incl. endnotes, bibliography or title pg.)-approx. 2000 - 2500 words

Chicago format (see www.chicagomanualofstyle.org for details)

Bibliography of a minimum of 5 sources that are ALL cited/quoted at least once in the body of the essay

Stages: Worth 5% of Final Mark:

1. Browse and Skim	/10
2. Annotated Bibliography	/15
3. Introductory Paragraph	/10
4. Rough Outline	<u>/10</u>
	45 mks.

Final Paper: Worth 10% of Final Mark:

100 marks (see rubric)

Submit 2 copies of final paper

## **Key Ideas to Keep in Mind:**

a) Frame your topic choice in the form of a *challenging FOCUS* QUESTION that could reasonably have at least 2 answers that could be defended:

## Ex. "Joseph Stalin's Russia: Would Karl Marx have been surprised?"

ie. "NO, Stalin was a good/ideal Marxist who correctly applied communist ideas to Russia"

OR

"YES, Stalin perverted Marx's ideas of Communism"

- b) The Essay must then seek to **persuade the reader** of the opinion you have formed about your person, movement, or event **based on the research** you have gathered and evaluated critically.
- c) A 4UI level essay should contain approximately 1/3 descriptive material on your subject (properly cited and sourced), the key historical facts that a reader should know in order to understand the opinion that you will be defending in the remaining 2/3 of your paper.
- d) The **persuasive section (2/3)** of your essay should focus on assessing:
  - i) How the subject (person/movement/event) has influenced the country's or the world's history (for better or for worse)
    OR
  - ii) How the subject has influenced our understanding/functioning of the contemporary world? (how can we understand our own world better by understanding what this person/event/movement did/accomplished/discovered/ etc.)

- e) Your opinion needs to be **SUPPORTED** by reliable and applicable **historical facts** and **quotes** from qualified "experts", properly cited in Chicago style in your paper.
- f) Some examples of possible topics:
  - Social Impacts of the Industrial Revolution
  - Karl Marx's Impact on "Country X"
  - The Role of Violence in the French Revolution
  - Bonaparte: Betrayer or Saviour of the Revolution?
  - Nationalism's Impact on Specific Country's History
  - Imperialism's Impact on "Country X"
  - Hitler's Rise in Germany: Force of Personality or Conditions of the Time?
  - Communism vs. Capitalism: A Comparison of Gender Roles
