## **Community Practicum Visitation Assignment** HSB4UI

Social agencies perform vital tasks in our communities. They identify and help the vulnerable. They also provide short-term support for those who need it and help those who, for a variety of economic and sociological reasons, constantly struggle in society.

Some social agencies are completely government funded, while others receive only partial funding and must privately fundraise for the rest. It is sometimes easy to forget that these "faceless institutions," at their very core, are groups of human beings helping other human beings. ## Your Task

- 1. Identify an agency that you want to visit and learn more about (see attached list for ideas.) Please keep in mind that some are more feasible to visit than others, and that you may need to proceed with sensitivity. Complete a proposal as a group that includes which agency you want to visit, why and what you know about them at this point. (1 paragraph) (5 marks)
- 2. Make an appointment to visit this agency in groups of 3 or 4, and speak to a representative there. Write the representatives' name, position, phone number and date and time you talked to them somewhere in your report.
- 3. Report on the following regarding the organization (suggested length in brackets):
- a) Who do they help? (1 paragraph) (3 marks)
- b) What is their mission statement ? (1 paragraph) (2 marks)
- c) How much of their funding comes from government and how much from other sources? (1 paragraph) (5 marks)
- d) What do they <u>specifically</u> do to help people and/or the community (how do they fulfill their mission statement?) Explain in detail. (1-2 pages) (20 marks)
- e) Does this agency do "good work"? Explain. (1 page) (5 marks)
- 4. Attach any related informational pamphlets or brochures.

5. Now that you know what the agency does, design a detailed project that is compatible with their mission statement. Provide a rationale, a detailed plan and "cost" the project. Assume you are on a charity version of "The Apprentice" or "Dragon's Den" and need to convince the judges of the merits of your plan. Feasibility will be evaluated. (2-3 pages) (30 marks)
