This essay will be a case study of a **social challenge** in a culture other than Canada, or a subculture within Canadian society, or a cultural comparison, at a specific time. Your thesis can be based around causes, effects, the extent of the social problem, possible solutions and/or what it tells us about the culture or the society. Focus on how attitudes contribute to the social challenge and/or how and why these attitudes exist, where applicable. Before you choose your subject, you should first make sure there is adequate information available from <u>reputable</u> sources about this topic.

Specific Requirements

Description

An essay at the 4UI level should contain one-third description (what.) This section of your essay should focus upon describing your subject, giving the reader the appropriate background information (rates, theories, statistics, etc.) **appropriately cited**.

Analysis

An essay at the 4UI level should contain approximately two-thirds analysis (why and how.) This section of your paper should focus analyzing your subject, proving your thesis by examining relevant information and specific examples.
