The Renaissance/Reformation Poster Project

You are living somewhere in Europe in the 16th Century. You are concerned about an issue which you want to see changed. It may have to do with religion (reformation), political or social organization, war, or some other social problem, as you perceive it.

Create a poster for a movement whose aim is to encourage a change.

Here is a list of examples:

You might be a follower of Martin Luther, attacking 'abuses' in the Catholic Church. You might be a Jesuit, encouraging Protestants to come back to the Catholic Church. You might be an artist, arguing for better treatment or more artistic freedom. You might be a peasant protesting the amount of taxation you have to pay to your landlord. (or calling for a revolt) You might be calling for unity in your homeland, or a change in how it's governed.

Whatever 'cause' you choose, keep the following in mind. (This is what I will be assessing it on.)

- 1. Be sure it actually 'fits' with 16th Century Europe. (avoid anachronisms)
- 2. Try to include as much accurate detail as possible. (Draw on notes, films, textbook, other sources, if you like)
- 3. Use as much creativity and care as possible.
